

Roadworks On Budds Lane

We have been told that there will be roadworks on Budds Lane starting on Friday 9th October with traffic lights in place from the 12th October continuing to the 30th October. On Friday 9th there will be no parking on Budds Lane as they will be setting up the area for the road works to start. Like any work though these dates potentially may change. The work will involve the use of temporary traffic lights and will likely cause some disruption, possibly significant disruption at peak times. Please see the map below for exactly where the works will be taking place.

We are recommending that parents use the car park opposite the skate park and then walk up to the school from there. Throughout October we are encouraging children to walk to school and this would count towards that.

Please allow extra time the week of the 12th October to get to school and park and please ensure you are parking responsibly and safely. Thank you.

Class Dojos

Many parents already know all about the Class Dojo system but for those that don't you may be a bit confused to what all of this 'Green Dojo' stuff is all about.



Class Dojo is our school reward system. We have set it up to praise children for showing one of the good learning values we teach in school. These are **persevering**, evaluating, collaborating, independence, using your imagination, being a good communicator, staying focused and questioning. As well as these we also give Dojos for good manners and now also good hygiene.

If a child shows one of these behaviours during the week any member of staff can award them with a green dojo. Sadly, sometimes Red Dojos are handed out for not following the school rules and expectations. All children have a little monster icon that represents them on the class Dojo system. At the end of the week the child with the most Green Dojos is the Class Dojo Champion. The class that has got the most Dojos overall is given a special trophy for the week.

This year we are counting the amount of Dojos that children get. When they reach 100 Dojos across a number of weeks they will get a special bronze badge, 200 for a silver and 300 for a gold.
