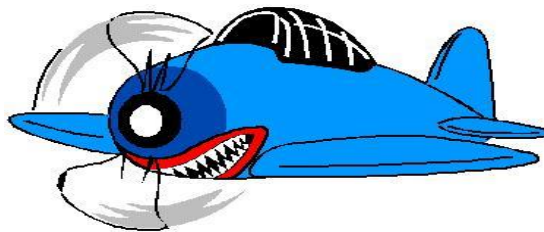


Our help is needed as a detective struggles to find out what grown ups do during the day.

**What job would you like to do when you grow up?**

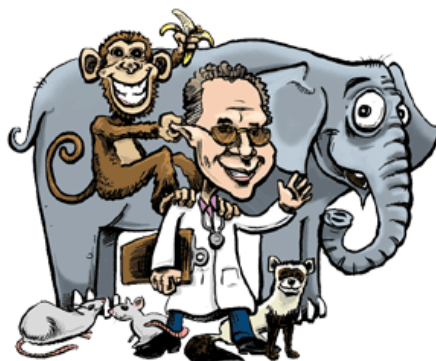


We will be looking at what equipment people use to do their different jobs.

We will pretend to be different occupations in our hospital role-play areas.

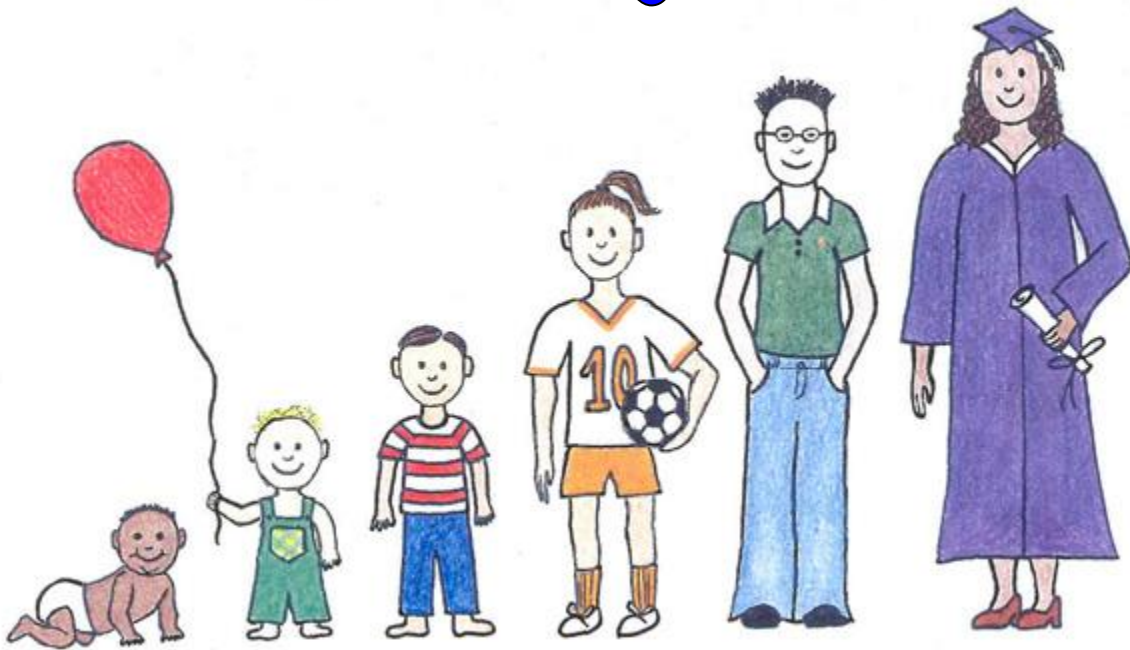


We will be looking at the outside environment and the changes in weather and plant life. We will also be looking at different textures and the words we use to describe touch and feel.
