

Walk Once a Week

All the local schools in Bordon are starting a new project next week. The project is run by the charity 'Living Streets' and is called Walk Once a Week. The aim of the project is to get children more active and reduce traffic around schools.

Along with the Junior School we will be recording how the children get to school each day. If the children walk at least once during the week over time they can earn a special badge. Cycling to school or scooting to school will also count.

We know many parents have to drive to school and we don't want those children to feel left out. For those parents and children if they park a little further away than normal and then walk the last few minutes that will count as 'Park and Stride'. For those children it would be very helpful if you as parents can talk to them on the days you 'Park and Stride' about what you are doing. This will help ensure the children do not get confused and miss out on achieving a badge.

The launch day for this project is next Thursday. Hopefully you will see the 'Living Streets' mascot around the school when you arrive in the morning. We hope this will have a positive impact

on our children and help raise the importance of keeping physically fit to them. We also hope it will help to reduce the traffic around school.
