School Results

Each year around this time schools get their official results from the government. As an Infant School we know straight away exactly what results the children have got and we do a lot of work identifying how we have done in comparison to previous years. What the government has just released is how well we as a school have done in comparison with all other schools nationally.

At the end of Year 2 the average expected level for a child is a level 2B. I am very pleased to say in all three areas Reading, Writing and Maths the school is above national levels. 83% of the children achieved level 2B or above in reading, 72% in writing and a staggering 91% in maths. The maths result was 13% above the national figure, which is an amazing result.

When you look at all the children's results we achieved the highest results for our school in over five years in writing and maths and equalled last year's highest results for reading.

The children and staff worked amazingly hard last year and deserve a big well done. Can I also say thank you to all the parents who do so much to support their child at home. Just reading with your child once a day has such a huge impact and so many of you do so much more.

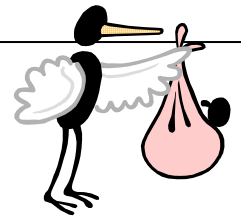
NSPCC Big Walk
