School Topics This Half Term

Year R

There are Pirates around in Year R this term so beware! The children have already had a fantastic time this week making treasure maps and setting up their Pirate themed role play areas. The teachers will use this topic to help support the children's scientific skills by looking at materials that float and materials that sink. They will also be learning about geography and map making and reading. The Pirate topic is also a great way to inspire children to write.

Year 1

Year 1 are learning to be historians this half term. They will be using a range of different sources of evidence, to find out what life was like for people in the past. They will focus on how houses are different now compared to a long time ago as well as experiencing what a Victorian school day might have been like.

Year 2

Year 2 are being travel guides this half term. They are learning all about the island of Fiji and comparing it to Bordon. They are looking at the differences and the similarities (if you look hard enough there are some similarities between Fiji and Bordon, not may, but some!). They will be writing travel guides after researching the island and its most important features. They will also be looking at how to have a healthy balanced meal.
