# **Parents Evening**

I hope you enjoyed the opportunity to come and look at your children's work and talk to their teacher over the last two nights. The children have been working very hard this half term and I am sure you are as proud of their achievements as we are. Please remember that if you would like to discuss anything about your child come and see us at any time.

You may have noticed a change to the way we have been doing maths at school. With the introduction of the new national curriculum we have extended the time we work on one particular aspect of maths. This is to help the children develop real mastery in that area. This however does leave gaps of a few weeks between different maths topics. To help the children remember the work they were doing a few week ago we have introduced a system where we have a maths book for each of the three main areas of maths. This is the reason children in Year 1 and 2 have three maths books they are working in.
