Research suggests that nearly 40% of patients who attend A&E are discharged without requiring treatment. Whilst 15% of patients could have been treated in the community. This does not mean that all these patients are attending A&E unnecessarily.

So where else can you go for medical advice?

Only call 999 or go to the Emergency Department in a genuine emergency:

- ⇒ loss of consciousness
- ⇒ acute confused state and fits that are not stopping
- ⇒ persistent, severe chest pain
- ⇒ breathing difficulties
- ⇒ severe bleeding that cannot be stopped

Threadworm

We have had some cases of Threadworm in school. Threadworms are white and look like small pieces of thread. You may notice them around your child's bottom or in your child's stools. They don't always cause symptoms, but people often notice itchiness around their bottom. This can be worse at night and can sometimes disturb sleep. If you think you or your child may have threadworms, you can usually treat the infection yourself with medication available at pharmacies without prescription.
