Can we please ask over half term that you provide your child with plain black shoes that are smart for school and robust enough for children to climb on the outside apparatus and run around the field in. They also need to be appropriate for sitting cross legged on the carpet (girls knee high boots are very uncomfortable after a while). We take great pride in our school as do the children. We also want the children to take pride in themselves and their appearance.
