Learning spellings is hard!

At the last parents evening, teachers were asked a lot of questions about how to help their child learn their spellings. The main reasons we do spelling tests is to improve the children's sight vocabulary and for them to write them correctly in their writing. The test is just half the process.

Here are some tips that we hope will make learning spellings a less stressful activity.

Remember what works for one child may not work for another, you know your child so pick the tips that best suit your child.

- 1. Pick 2 words a day, resist writing them all out every day as it can get quite tiring.
- 2. Read the words and verbally put them in sentences with your child.
- 3. Choose a word, read each letter slowly, getting quicker and quicker i.e f l i g h t,
- 4. Make a spelling picture Write a word out in lots of different colours.
- 5. Play hangman with the spelling words.
- 6. Write some words out with some of the letters incorrect and your child can correct your spellings.
