Caretaker Needed

Very sadly our wonderful Site Manager, Mrs Goss, has decided that managing two schools is too much now. She has decided that she will just manage Bordon Juniors after Christmas.

This means that we are looking for someone to take on the role of school caretaker.

The job needs someone with good organisational skills. There are a lot of Health and Safety checks that need doing every month and paperwork that needs filling in to go with those checks.

The job also needs someone who can work with the school procedures and report repairs that need doing, and where necessary oversee the contractors to ensure the job is done.

The role also involves organising the cleaning of the school, both inside and outside, and working with our two wonderful cleaners to ensure the high standards we have are maintained.

Prior knowledge and training are not a requirement as training will be provided. The health and the safety of our children is of paramount importance and Hampshire schools have very specific procedures they must follow so anyone taking on the role will undertake this training.

The role needs someone for 15 hours a week from 3:30pm to 6:30pm Monday to Friday. The pay range starts at £8.93 per hour increasing to £9.74 through pay progression.

The key requirement of the role is that the person cares about the children, their wellbeing, safety and the environment they learn in. The successful candidate will be working alongside the rest of the staff so there is a big team to be a part of.
