# <u>Great South Run</u> <u>Fundraising</u>

On the 20<sup>th</sup> October Mrs Lockyer, Mrs Ibbs and Miss Wong will be taking part in the Great South Run. The run is a ten mile course around Portsmouth.

The three ladies are running to raise money to buy a defibrillator for the school. At the end of last term the staff had their First Aid Training, as part of this training was the fact that if a defibrillator is used in the first 3-4 minutes of a victim having a cardiac arrest their chances of survival can increase from around 6% to around 75%. This fact alone spurred the three ladies on to want to raise money so the school can buy one.

As much as we would like to be able to fund one ourselves, and there is an argument that as a school we should, sadly the cost of the defibrillator is beyond what limited resources we have. The price of a defibrillator is significantly more than we give one Year Group for their entire annual budget to spend on pens, books, and resources for the children. Sadly it is just not something we can afford by ourselves.

If you would like to help these three wonderful ladies they have set up a page on Just Giving, once on there type in Bordon Infants and make your donation. Alternatively you can make a cash donation by handing it into the school office or the class teacher.

If every family in the school donated just £5.50 then we could raise £1,000 for this potentially lifesaving equipment.

The ladies target is to raise £1,500 to get a fully installed defibrillator. So please donate anything you can. The statistics on this are shocking once you start looking into it. Around 30,000 sudden cardiac arrests occur outside of hospitals every year and only 1% survive due mainly to lack of knowledge and equipment. We are seeking to change that for our school community. Whatever you can give no matter how big or small will make a huge difference.

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Parking on Budds Lane

The parking along Budds lane has become a little bit complex in the past few weeks.

We have been told that parking enforcement will be taking place on random days and we do not want people to be caught out.

There are, we believe four different types of parking restrictions now in force along Budds Lane. Yellow school zigzag lines, white pedestrian crossing zigzags, double yellow and single yellow lines.
