Icy Conditions

If the ground is very icy we may make the decision not to open the gate on the top playground. That playground gets very slippery and we do not have enough grit to cover the entire area. We do not want anyone to fall on the ice so we will just open the Budds Lane gate and the School Road gate.

Sickness and Diarrhoea

Just a reminder of NHS, Hampshire and the Schools policy on children being sick or having diarrhoea.

Children must be off school for 48 hours after the sickness has completely stopped.

If they are last sick at 11:30 on a Tuesday then they are able to come back to school after lunch on Thursday. We can make no exceptions to this 48 hour rule as schools have had to temporally shut if the illness spreads and too many children get sick.

We know the difficulty taking time off causes parents but we have to think of the health of all the children in school.

Staffing changes for 2020

To cover the days she is not working we have moved Mrs Marshall from Kangaroos on a Thursday and Friday to work in Tigers.
